Chair Bagby called the meeting to order. Mr. Mitchell presented a proposal to recreate an Animal Welfare Board. Chair Bagby continued with the review of the Agenda. Mrs. Elrod asked the Commission to add a third Proclamation to recognize Peace Officers Memorial Week.

Commissioner Wallace made a motion to enter into Executive Session to discuss personnel, litigation, and potential property acquisition. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hancock. The motion carried 5-0.

- **II. INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO FLAG** Commissioner Hancock led the Commission in the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA Commissioner Maxey made a motion to approve the Agenda with the addition of a third Proclamation and a correction to item #3 under Consent Agenda to change from Webstaurant Store to Central Restaurant as well as the low bid amount. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Wallace. The motion carried 5-0.

VI. SPECIAL RECOGNITION

1. 4-H LifeSmarts Team — Chair Bagby stated the LifeSmarts team was here tonight to recognize their efforts at the 2022 National LifeSmarts Championship in Washington, DC and thanked them for being in attendance. The Floyd County 4-H team placed 5th in the Nation, with Elan McClain placing 3rd nationally in the Environment Assessment, and Sara Grace Abernathy being awarded a scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.00 from Norton LifeLock for her essay on Identity Theft.

Team members Sara Grace Abernathy and Seth Moon, from Model High School, Elan McClain from Armuchee High School, and Miss Abernathy stated Bryson Williams, who is homeschooled, was also on their team but was not in attendance, introduced themselves and Miss Abernathy made a statement.

Miss Abernathy: "LifeSmarts has taught me so many valuable life lessons. Beyond learning what a healthy BMI range is, and what FAFSA stands for, the competition experience helped me learn how to work with others, and win, and lose, with poise. I was reminded of the importance of dedication and a positive attitude. Files Z22-04-03 and SUP22-04-01 requesting rezoning from Suburban Residential (S-R) to Agricultural Residential (A-R) for property at 125 Davis Road; Floyd County Tax Parcel F18027, F18026 and F18025, as well as a Special Use Permit for an event venue. The Planning staff recommended approval with conditions of going to Board of Adjustments for setback variances. The Planning Commission voted 7-0 to approve with conditions, as well as 7-0 approval for the SUP.
- 3. File Z22-05-01 requesting rezoning from Heavy Industrial (H-I) to Light Industrial (L-I) at O Calhoun Hwy/W. Hermitage Road; Floyd County Tax Parcel L11Z003. The Planning staff recommended approval. The Planning Commission voted 7-0 to approve.
- **4.** File Z22-05-02 requesting rezoning request from Community Commercial (C-C) to Suburban Residential (S-R) at 23 Melody Lane NW; Floyd County Tax Parcel H13X207. The Planning staff recommended approval. The Planning Commission voted 7-0 to approve.
- 5. File SUP22-05-02 requesting a Special Use Permit for the development of miniature warehouses for property at 3142 Maple Road, S.E.; Floyd County Tax Parcel J16X283. The Planning staff recommended approval. The Planning Commission voted 7-0 to approve.
- 6. File Z22-05-06 requesting rezoning from Community Commercial (C-C) to Suburban Residential (S-R) at 1806 C Pleasant Valley Road, Silver Creek, GA 30173; Floyd County Tax Parcel L17140. The Planning staff recommended approval. The Planning Commission voted 7-0 to approve.

- **XVI. CONSENT AGENDA** Mrs. Elrod reported the Consent Agenda was in order with the approved change to item #3. Commissioner Hancock made a motion to approve, seconded by Commissioner Wallace. The motion carried 5-0.
 - Consider request from Facilities to ratify the purchase of a new control system for the HVAC unit at the Floyd County Health Department in the amount of \$13,320.00 from Control Concepts, LLC. The system had crashed and had to be replaced.
 - 2. Consider request from Purchasing to approve the purchase of a Vulcan K40GL Series Steam Kettle from Webstaurant Store in the amount of \$21,725.00 for the Floyd County Prison. This was budgeted at \$25,000.00 in 2022 Capital.
 - 3. Consider request from Purchasing to approve the purchase of a 60 Quart Mixer from Central Restaurant in the amount of \$24,495.00 for the Floyd County Jail. This was budgeted at \$11,825.00 in 2022 Capital. The remaining \$14,700.00 will be paid using inmate benefit funds.

XVIII. NEW BUSINESS

1. Consider request from Purchasing to approve the Blacks Bluff Culvert Project in the amount of \$767,600.00 from Cornerstone Concrete Development, LLC. This will be funded through LMIG and ARPA funding.

— Mr. McCord presented the request to the Commission for approval. Commissioner Hancock asked Mr. McCord to explain the delay in the project. Mr. McCord stated they asked and did receive State funding, and during that process, they had hoped the steel plate pipe could be rehabilitated. However, it was determined after assessments from staff and multiple consultants, and after gathering a full scope of work, this was the best solution for the situation.

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Commissioner Maxey made a motion to approve, seconded by Vice Chair Watters. The motion carried 5-0.

2. Consider request from Public Works to approve the addition of two roads to the 2022 SPLOST paving list: Old Dalton Road (Highway 140 to Highway 156) at and Trent Drive (Hampton East Subdivision). This will be an addition of \$407,000 to the 2017 SPLOST budget for 2022. — Mr. McCord presented the request to the Commission for approval. Commissioner Wallace made a motion to approve, seconded by Vice Chair Watters. The motion carried 5-0.
